AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING

OF FRIENDS (HOMEWOOD)

Held: Eleventh Month 17, 1955 by adjournment from Tenth Month 27

Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Homewood) met at 8 P.M., Fifth Day, Eleventh Month 17, 1955 by adjournment from Tenth Month 27, 1955. There were 25 members present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

The Nominating Committee reported the name of J. Brownie Newman to serve for a term of three years as a member of the Meeting on Ministry and Counsel.

Haverford Monthly Meeting confirmed receipt of the certificate of removal from Homewood of John R. Cary, and reported that he had been accepted into membership with that Meeting.

The Clerk read an invitation from Stony Run Meeting inviting members of Homewood to join with Stony Run Friends in a Meeting for Worship to be held on Thanksgiving Day at 10:30 A.M.

The Clerk read a letter from James F. Walker accepting the Meeting's invitation to the Executive Committee of the Friends World Committee, American Section, to meet in Baltimore. The meeting will be held First Month 20 to 22, 1956, and an attendance of 50 is expected. The Hospitality Committee was asked to join with the corresponding committees of the other Baltimore Meetings in making preparations.

The Clerk read a letter from the Guilford College Choir regarding the possibility of the Choir presenting a concert at Homewood Third Month 23, 1956. The Secretary was asked to secure more details.

A communication was received from the two Baltimore Yearly Meeting Secretaries giving instructions on the preparation of reports.

A second communication from the Yearly Meeting Secretaries asked Homewood Meeting to submit the name of one member to the Yearly Meeting Nominating Committee for each of the following Yearly Meeting committees: Evangelism and Outreach, Education, Christian Education, Missions, Public Morals, Peace and Social Order. The Nominating Committee was asked to submit names of persons who had not already served on the committees, so far as possible.

The special committee to arrange meetings for visiting Friends was discharged from further duties.

Steven Simon, speaking for the Social Order Committee, urged that Homewood Meeting join with Stony Run Meeting in the operation of McKim Center. Sally Myers, of Stony Run, spoke on the background of the Center and its present work. Miriam Brailey, Brownie Newman, Richard Carey and Elizabeth Loucks were appointed to secure more detailed information and report to the next Monthly Meeting. Whereupon, at 10:05 P.M. the meeting concluded in silence.
