AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING
OF FRIENDS (HOMEWOOD)

Held: Sixth Month 28, 1956

Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Homewood) met at 8 P.M. Fifth Day, Sixth Month 28, 1956. There were seventeen members present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

The report of representatives to Quarterly Meeting held at Deer Creek was received. All representatives but one attended. Our representatives told of the benefits gained from visiting with Friends in their own communities and reported on the sessions of the Meetings for Ministry and Counsel and the business meeting. This included a report of plans for an intervisitation day among Friends on one First Day in the fall, a discussion of problems of the aged and a report on the Five Years Meeting business sessions.

The committee for Ministry and Counsel asked that it be allowed to report at the next Monthly Meeting on its nominations of persons to act with Stoney Run Meeting on plans for Friends visiting Baltimore in the fall of 1956, and plans for the Friends World Committee to meet in January, 1957.

A letter was read from "A Group for the Duties of Conscience" connected with Palo Alto Friends Monthly Meeting telling of its concerns and asking this Meeting's cooperation and urging formation of a similar group here. This led to discussion of the recent stand of the Board of Regents of the University of Maryland in connection with Barry Carr. It has been reported that that Board stands firm on its original position regarding objection to R.O.T.C. on grounds of conscience. The Meeting asked Marlin Dawson to communicate with Frederick Weisgal to find out if this is so. If this is a fact, the Meeting asked that a letter be sent to the Board of Regents of the University thanking them for their consideration and expressing our disappointment; asking them to keep open minds on the matter. This letter is to go over the signature of the Clerk.

A communication from the American Conference on Race Relations to be held at Wilmington College over Labor Day week-end was read. This letter was to inform us of the conference and ask for an expression of interest. Baltimore Yearly Meeting has been allotted three representatives. Each quarter shall have one representative. The Yearly Meeting executive committee will make final appointments.

The Committee on Displaced Persons, a sub-committee of the Social Order Committee made its final report. The Krasnakutsky family have received their final citizenship papers and are well established in the community. The Meeting thanked the committee for its work and asked them to keep in touch with the family.
