AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING

OF FRIENDS (HOMEWOOD)

Held: Second Month 28, 1957

Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Homewood) met at 7:50 P.M., Fifth Day, Second Month 28, 1957. There were 25 members present.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

It was announced that the Camp Committee for the purchase of a camp site has now incorporated, and that the option on the site has been extended awaiting a determination of pending court proceedings.

Eleanor Richardson announced that the Homewood Discussion Group would meet on Friday evenings in the future for discussions of United States foreign policy.

Representatives to Quarterly Meeting held First Month 9, 1957 reported a good meeting.

The report of Jeane Mason Smith, chairman of the Library Committee, was read. It stated that the Committee would probably be able to assemble a display of Whittier's works with a picture of the poet.

West Baltimore Meeting reported that it had given through consideration to changing its meeting place to Fellowship House. The move has, however, been delayed due to the fact that Stony Run Friends had questioned the advisability of meeting at Fellowship House. The Joint Committee on Preparative Meetings reported that it had considered the question of whether association with Fellowship House would weaken West Baltimore Meeting. The suggestion that West Baltimore Friends meet with the Committee to further consider the question was approved. Further report is to be made at the next meeting.

Marlin Dawson reported the proposed visit of Delbert and Julia Reynolds on First Day, Third Month 17, 1957. The Meeting extended an invitation for that day and plans will be made for a carry-in dinner.

Eric Tucker, secretary of London Yearly Meeting's Peace Committee with visit Homewood on Third Month 28. Since this will fall on the evening for Monthly Meeting, it was agreed that dinner would be served at 6 P.M., Monthly Meeting would convene at 7 P.M. and that Eric Tucker would be asked to speak at 8:15 P.M. The Joint Peace Committee was asked to make the necessary arrangements.

The Meeting approved the expenditure of \$1,100 for the repair of its St. Johns Road property.

It was reported that Quarterly Meeting had determined that Homewood Meeting's share of the Yearly Meeting budget for 1957 should be \$4,010.13.
