It was reported that Stony Run Meeting had agreed to join with Homewood in sponsoring Suhail Khelif, an Arab from Nazareth who wishes to study at the Johns Hopkins University. The Joint Social Order Committee recommended the following members from Homewood to be appointed to a special committee for his guidance: Ruthanna Moon, Thomas W. Y. Clark, and Marlin Dawson. This was approved. Three additional members are to be appointed by Stony Run Meeting. It was reported that the Miles White Society will give \$200 towards his assistance and that \$100 will have to be raised from individual contributions.

Doris Shanloffer reported upon the activities of West Baltimore Meeting which is now meeting at Fellowship House.

The Clerk read a letter from the American Friends Service Committee advising the Meeting of two institutes on "The Quaker Approach to Contemporary Affairs". Hope was expressed that someone would be found who could attend one of the institutes and this was referred to the Joint Peace Committee for action.

The Meeting approved of the proposal that Homewood join with Stony Run Meeting and West Baltimore Meeting in writing to the President of the United States and the Council of Churches expressing our hope that H Bomb tests will be discontinued. The Joint Peace Committee was requested to compose the letter.
