AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING

OF FRIENDS (HOMEWOOD)

Held: Ninth Month 26, 1957

Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Homewood) met at 8:05 P.M., Fifth Day, Ninth Month 26, 1957. There were 21 members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

Miriam Brailey reported on the Quarterly Meeting held at Sandy Spring Ninth Month 15, 1957. The report engendered a discussion of the needs for pastoral work in the care of the membership and the means of growth of the Society.

The Meeting reconsidered the question whether the meetings on Larger Quaker Concerns should be held on second Fourth Days of each month. It was decided that such meetings would not be held in Tenth and Eleventh Months, and that the matter would be given further consideration at the next Monthly Meeting.

The Clerk read a letter from the Council of Churches for Maryland and Delaware announcing that there would be a World Day of Prayer on Sixth Day, Second Month 21, 1958.

A second letter from the Council of Churches asked the Meeting to forward the names of members to serve on the Departments and Committees of the Maryland-Delaware Council. The matter was referred to the Nominating Committee with power to name the Meeting's representatives without further reference to the Monthly Meeting.

The Clerk read a letter from the Schuitt family thanking the Meeting for the assistance it has rendered in establishing the family in this country. The Clerk was asked to reply, expressing the pleasure with which the Meeting received the letter. The Meeting expressed its appreciation to the Social Order Committee for the work it has done in caring for the family.

Doris Shanleffer reported on the activities of the West Baltimore Meeting.

Upon the request of Margaret Hunter, the balance left over from the camp scholarship fund was directed to be applied to paying for a second sitter for the children in the nursery on First Days.
