

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING

OF FRIENDS (HOMewood)

Held: Eleventh Month 21, 1957

Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Homewood) met at 8:15 P.M., Fifth Day, Eleventh Month 21, 1957. There were 24 members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

After consideration, the meeting decided to hold the next Monthly Meeting at the usual time, Twelfth Month 26, 1957.

Elizabeth Carpenter, chairman of the Finance Committee, after giving a statistical breakdown of participation in raising the 1957 budget, presented the 1958 budget for the approval of the meeting. The budget, showing an increase of \$1,367.57, or 8.5 %, over the previous year, was tentatively adopted as follows:

The Meeting requested the Clerk to write to the Meeting Trustees authorizing the use of the full income from the Nicholson Fund as a part of the \$6300 budgeted to be received by the Meeting from the Trustees. Thus, the income from this Fund will not continue to accrue as a designated reserve, and will be more than used for payment of babysitters and similar uses within the terms of the bequest.

The Executive Committee recommended that Monthly Meeting be held at 7:15 P.M. rather than 7:30 P.M. so that the concerns of the Meeting's standing committees could be more carefully considered. Further consideration of this recommendation was postponed to the next meeting.

The Executive Committee announced that it had arranged to run an advertisement each Seventh Day in the Sunpapers in which Meeting activities could be announced.

The Meeting again considered the matter of John Sexton's request for financial assistance in attending the Bad Piorment, Germany, meeting of the Friends World Committee, but the meeting not being in unity, the matter was postponed to the next meeting.

After a period of silence, the meeting concluded at 10 o'clock.
