to unite with a committee of men friends in visiting Indian Spring preparative meeting and report to our next monthly meeting.

Then adjourned.

The preparative meeting informed that Margaret Cheston (formerly Carey) has had her marriage accomplished contrary to the established order of our society; Dorothy Hopking, and Anna Proctor are appointed to visit her on the occasion.

Mary Troth requested a certificate to Twelfth Street Monthly Meeting, Philadelphia; Grace Hopking, and Sarah Webster are appointed to prepare one.
