The Circumstance of Elkridge Preparative Meeting a Branch of this Monthly Meeting, not having reported thereto since the Eleventh Month 1828, referred at our last Meeting to this, being now brought into view. After a time of Weighty Deliberation thereon, and having taken the fullest view of which it has been capable, both of the duty that a Monthly Meeting owes to its Branches, and the Branches and Members to the Monthly Meeting, United in the judgement Womens Meeting concurring therein, that as that Preparative Meeting, and also the Meeting held at the Cliffs, have become insubordinate, and have united themselves to a Body claiming to be the Yearly Meeting of Baltimore, and which by an act of its own in the year 1828, in contravention of the Discipline by which it professed to be governed, closed the way to all labour and intercourse on the part of this Meeting
