Extracts from the minutes of men's yearly meeting, also a letter of counsel from the same to the subordinate meetings within its limits, were severally read to the satisfaction of this meeting.

A communication was received from Philadelphia monthly meeting for the Northern district stating, that they had at our request, visited Mary Ann Garretson, & that they did not believe further labour would be beneficial. Sarah Jannet & Ann Jones were appointed to join men friends in preparing a testimony of disownment to be produced at next meeting.

Our friend John P. Balderston laid before this meeting, a prospect he had of making a religious visit to the friends of Philadelphia, which this meeting uniting with, the clerk was directed to join the clerk of men's meeting in signing a minute to that effect.

A communication was received from Springborough Monthly meeting, stating that they had paid the necessary attention to Ann Lowndes and Bethulah Lowndes, & that neither of them manifested any disposition to this meeting. Parthenia Dukehart & Hannah Talbot were

appointed to prepare a testimony of disownment & produce it to next meeting.

Gunpowder monthly meeting having requested this meeting to visit Rebecca Russell (late Smith) who has had her marriage accomplished contrary to the order of friends, & is in connection with the separatists, Hannah Stabler & Hannah Talbot were appointed to that service.

The committee in conjunction with the overseers, informed this meeting that they had visited Mary Stabler, Mary Roberts, Elizabeth Gardley, Catharine Dare, Elizabeth W. Dare, Cassandra S. Dare, Ann Wetherald, Mary Wetherald & Esther Wetherald & that they did not manifest any disposition to make satisfaction to this meeting. Mary Robertson and Margaret Balderston were appointed to prepare a testimony of disownment if they should find no cause to forbear.

An acknowledgement from Elizabeth Ann Gower was read, and approved but left in men's meeting for further consideration.
