

tion of the whole question, they believe that the interest of the whole Meeting, and especially that of the children and younger members of the Meeting will be greatly helped by placing the religious instruction as carried on in the Bible School, with its various classes in the school building, and devoting its cheerful rooms to this purpose and the various other religious and philanthropic work which engages the attention of our members. In this way these works, all of which are educational, may be extended, which is impossible in the Meeting House: they, therefore request the Monthly Meeting to authorize the committee to make such disposition of the Building, and to use such portion of the sum of money in hand received from the rentals, to put the building in complete and suitable condition for this work - and thereafter to apply the interest accruing from the invested balance to the proper care of the building and the support of the work - it being understood that any promises made by the committee to individuals be not interfered with.
