1st ans. Our Meetings for worship and discipline have all been duly held, and well attended by most of our members, except First-day evening Meetings, which continual small: greater punctuality desirable on the part of some. No unbecoming behaviour to report.

2nd. ans. We believe Friends have love towards each other, becoming our Christian profession. We do not know of any tale-bearing, detraction or differences amongst us.

3rd. ans. We believe Friends endeavor by example and precept to bring up their children, and those under their care in

the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and to some extent in that simplicity of life which the Gospel enjoins. They are counseled against pernicious reading and corrupt associations, and there are encouraged to read the Holy Scriptures.

4th ans. Friends maintain our testimony to a free Gospel Ministry agreeably to our discipline.

5th. ans. Friends are careful to maintain our testimony against the use of all intoxicating liquors; a few are not clear as regards attending frivolous places of diversion.

6th. ans. The necessities of the poor are inspected, and to some extent relieved; they are advised and assisted in such employments as they are capable of.

7th. ans. Friends' children attend school, and when practicable, schools under the care of Friends.

8th. ans. They do as far as we know.

9th. ans. We believe Friends are careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and avoid involving themselves in
