The following satisfactory report from the Association for Christian Work was read.

To Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends.

The Association for Christian Work submit their annual report as follows.

The work of the Association has been conducted on the same plans as heretofore: the work of the various committees being done by volunteers, and the means for carrying on the work by voluntary contributions.

The Bible School work at Cutaw st. Meeting has been conducted on practically the same plans as heretofore.

The advantages offered by the Institute building have been much appreciated by the Association, and we believe aided it greatly in its work.

The attendance at the First-day School

has been somewhat larger than last year; averaging 62, an increase of 6, and the collections for Foreign Missions \$80.⁷⁹, an increase of \$11.¹⁴.

During the past year "The Boys Institute Club," and "The Girls Club," were started, with the object in view of interesting the younger members of the Meeting. Both Clubs held regular meetings during the winter months with satisfactory results.

The regular Monthly Socials of the Association were held as in previous years.

The work at Light street under the care of the Association continues to prosper.

The Boys Meeting has had an average attendance of 166, an increase over last year of 13.

The Girls' Sewing School introduced a new method of work this year, (that taught by Miss Richardson) The attendance has not been so large as last year, but the work done has been more satisfactory.

The Mothers' Meeting has continued as usual, and we believe many of those at-
