To Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends.

The committee appointed in Fourth month last to consider the case of Charles J. Cary, as presented in the communication made to that meeting by the Oversers, hereby report,

That having conferred with the Oversers, and read the correspondence between them and Charles J. Cary, they carefully examined the testimony as copied from the proceedings of the Courts wherein the objectionable conduct of the said Charles J. Cary was revealed.

That the conduct was found to be of such a character that they could not recommend his retention as a member of this meeting, unless, upon an interview with him, he should appear to be penitent, and resolved to conform his life to a truthful and consistent standard hereafter.

That they have had such an interview, in which he seemed to realize the immorality of his conduct, and expressed his willingness freely to give any further information to the present representatives of Anna Reed's estate (the complainants in the suits referred to) which they might desire, and that he has since signed and forwarded to the committee a written declaration and acknowledgment which is herewith submitted.
