at times, but we believe that through his faithful and conscientious labors, good results have been obtained. We regret that he felt it necessary to give up the work about a month ago, and we sympathize with him, but having a growing family he thought it due his children to remove to a locality where they would have better educational advantages.

John F. Marduck for many years a worker among the Indians has been selected to take Charles C. Pearson's place, and we hope that his work may be successful.

We have continued our aid to this mission for another year, and have appropriated the sum of \$275.- towards the support of the same.
