

At a called meeting of the Trustees of Balt. Monthly Meeting of Friends held 2<sup>nd</sup> Mo. 22<sup>nd</sup> 1886. present, F. J. King, James Carey, Jas. C. Thomas & John C. Thomas.

The Home Mission Ass<sup>n</sup>. proposed that the Trustees should change the janitor of the Federal Hill Mission Building, but the matter was referred back to that ass<sup>n</sup>. for decision, as more properly belonging to it.

We were informed that the chairman of the Building Committee of the Johns Hopkins University had refused to pay any part of the cost of wall between the yard of our Meeting House & that of the Biological Laboratory.

The Secretary reported that he had made the following statement to the Monthly Meeting of the property belonging to it in our charge

1. Lot cor. Cutaw & Monument sts 137 x 72 ft, bought in 3<sup>rd</sup> Mo. 1864, at a cost of \$15,000. improved by a brick meeting-house 71 x 54 ft, built in 1867, at a cost of \$31,000. (of which \$6276.<sup>69</sup> was paid out of the funds of the Yearly Meeting): also, by a brick school-house, 72 x 29, built in 1875 by Thos. Wilson & presented to the Monthly Meeting, & now rented at \$600. pr. ann. for a girls school of high grade. The cost of school building was \$15,900.-: of furniture \$1450.- & of walls, & grading & paving yard, \$1650, making the total of \$19,000, given by Thos. Wilson.

2. Lot 318 Light st, 56 x 331, bought in 2<sup>nd</sup> Mo. 1871, at a cost of \$6500. (of which \$3000.- was contributed by Miles White) improved by a brick Mission building 42 x 120 ft built in 1880, at a cost of \$14,600. <sup>including</sup> the fencing, paving & furnishing.
