

3. Forty shares Nat. Mechanics Bank stock, worth about \$480. - the remnant of a legacy from Nicholas Popplein, Senr. (for relief of poor)

4. \$2000. of Balt. City Loan, payable in 1890, + \$532.25 in Central Savings Bank. This is the proceeds of an old legacy of \$500. from Andrew Scholfield of Alexandria for educating poor children of Balt. Monthly Meeting. There being none such for many years, the interest accumulated + is now being applied to the support of Mission schools on Federal Hill.
