In accordance with the instructions of the Monthly Meeting held 1st month last, the Trustees have made sale of the old meeting house property near Lincoln, Va. for \$350.- subject to a claim in equity of the heirs of Wm Smith for \$100.-, leaving net proceeds \$250.-; of which, \$200.- have been paid, & applied towards the liquidation of the debt remaining against the new meeting house. The expenses of the sale will be deducted from the \$50.- yet to be paid, & the balance will be applied as above.

\$500.- was received from Miles White Jr. Treasr. being a legacy from our late dear friend Matilda Reed. It was decided to put it into the Savings Bank for the present.

Plans for five small houses to be built on the rear of Friends Mission property on Federal Hill were submitted & approved. Bids for the erection of the same were received, as follows, viz. from J. Haswell & Son for \$5053.- from E. W. Beckman for \$5000.- & from E. W. Haviland for \$4500.- It was decided to give the contract to E. W. Haviland, & to meet the cost by cash in the Savings Bank from the legacies of Andrew Scholfeld & Matilda Reed, & by the sale of \$2000.- City Stock & 40 shares of Mechanics Bank stock; the balance, say \$600.-
