At a meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends held 3rd Mo. 21. 1889 present Francis J. King, James Carey, James C. Thomas, Jesse Tyson, Joseph P. Elliott & John C. Thomas.

The Secretary reported that the loan of \$800.- from Geo. Edw Clark, with the interest thereon, had been paid out of the legacy of \$1000.- from Mary King Warder. It was decided to use the remainder of that legacy in permanently improving the southern boundary of the Federal Hill Mission lot by a brick retaining wall up to the level of the adjoining property. The

whole of the Mary King Warder legacy will then have been invested in said property.

It was decided to report to the Monthly Meeting as follows.

Dear friends.

Our last report was dated 4th Mo. 1st 1888. In the following month we received a legacy of \$1000.- from the estate of our late dear friend Mary King Warder, the interest on which is to be used in carrying on the work of Friends Mission at Federal Hill. Believing that no better investment of the legacy can be found than in clearing off the indebtedness on the houses already built upon the property, we paid off the \$800.- that had been borrowed to complete them, and now propose to use the balance in erecting a retaining wall & fence where it is much needed, so that the entire legacy may
