

At a meeting of the Trustees of Balt. Monthly Meeting of Friends held 2nd Mo. 18. 1891 present Francis T. King, Pres. Jas. Carey, Dr Jas. C. Thomas, Jos. P. Elliott, & John C. Thomas, Secty.

The Comtee appointed to propose a plan for holding the title to Ashton Meeting House produced a Deed for the same to Ashton Monthly Meeting providing for the reversion of the property to Balt. Mo. Mtg in case of the discontinuance of Ashton Monthly Meeting. The Deed was approved & John C. Thomas was appointed our attorney to acknowledge the same.

John C. Thomas reported having attended to kalsomining the interior of the Mission House on Light st. & procuring cocoa matting for the large room, & collecting subscriptions sufficient to pay for said improvements, which amounted to \$490.-

Dr Jas. C. Thomas & Jos. C. Thomas were appointed to attend to the putting up of storm doors on the front of meeting house

corner of Cutlaw & Monument sts, also shades for the side windows, as authorized by the Monthly Meeting.

In reference to the claim of the Monthly Meeting against the estate of our deceased Friend Ann Eliza Hopkins, it was decided to ^{waive} any claim for interest, & all charges on account of her personal support, & to insist only on the amount advanced for the benefit of the real estate, together with the funeral expenses of herself & aunt Sophia.
