

before the Monthly Meeting.

The Trustees refer to the report of the Treasurer of the Monthly Meeting in 1st mo. last, for the receipts & disbursements of the income for 1898 from the different funds in their charge. These accounts have been examined by two Trustees & found correct. There has been no change in investments.

The generous gift of \$5000.- made by our Friend Elizabeth Reed towards the funds of the Meeting, has been the most notable feature of the past year. The same has been invested as follows; viz. \$2000.- Georgia Southern & Florida R.R. Bonds, costing \$2065.⁰⁰; \$2000.- Northern Pacific R.R. Bonds, costing \$1950.-; \$1,000.- Union Pacific R.R. Bonds, costing \$968.⁷⁵.

The houses on James Alley have been kept in repair & rented out as usual, & the net proceeds applied as heretofore.

The furnaces which were placed in the Mission building on Light st. when

it was erected in 1880, having become worn out, they were replaced by new ones last summer at a cost of \$266.- which was raised by private subscription. But for their great efficiency, the building would have been almost useless during the very severe weather of the past winter.

The meeting-house corner of Cutaw & Monument sts has been thoroughly renovated inside & out & a new carpet & new cushions furnished to the main room & the benches widened. Of the total cost (\$1448.⁹²) \$1084.⁷⁵ was the gift of our friend Mary McCullough, & the balance, \$364.¹⁷ was made up by subscriptions from other members.
