

At a meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends held 1st mo 20th 1913, there were present Miles White Jr., Richard J. White, John N. Parker and John R. Barry.

The appropriation of \$100 from the income of the Francis White Fund to the Light St. Free Kindergartens was approved.

The Treasurer was authorized to buy for \$100 of the J. F. F. Martineau Fund \$100 of the First Preferred Stock of the Georgia Southern & Florida Ry. and to appropriate the remainder of the accrued income to the cost of repairs to the Light St. building.

The President and John N. Parker were requested to audit the accounts of the Treasurer and report to the Monthly Meeting.

At a called meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends held 6th mo. 3rd 1914 - there were present the President, Secretary and Miles White Jr. and John N. Parker.

The President presented estimates from two plumbers for the work of sewer connections at Light St. aggregating about \$350 for the fire houses and \$250 for the Meeting House. He was authorized to have the work done by the lowest bidder; the cost to be divided into two parts, half to be paid out of this year's income and the other half to be borrowed from the accrued income of the Francis White Fund and repaid from next year's income from the property.

Plans for the sewer and plumbing work at Antau It were also presented and the President was directed to proceed with the work promptly, the cost to be met by using as much of this year's income as possible and the balance to be taken from the invested fund known as the General Expense Fund.
