At a meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting held July month 26th 1914, all the members were present.

The method of meeting the heavy expense of conducting with the new sewer system, referred to us by the ~~yearly~~ Monthly Meeting, was considered.

The Treasurer reported that \$461 was needed for the Eutaw St. meeting house, \$327 for the Light St. meeting house, and \$75 for the James Alley, now Patapasco St., houses. Also about \$60 above the income of the Thos. Wilson Fund for the Institute on Eutaw St.

It was decided to apply the income from the Patapasco St. houses for two years, and at the present time to borrow from accumulated income, and from a Friend who offers to lend the money, enough to pay the amount due, leaving until the next fiscal year the determination of the method of final payment.

Also to ask the Monthly Meeting to authorize the payment of the balance on the Institute from the income of the Martener Fund.
