

At a meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting held May 2^d 1921 - all the members were present.

The architect selected by the committee on new Meeting House, Edward L. Palmer, Jr., presented the tabulated bids for building the same, the bid of Hicks Lane & Norris being the lowest. Their sub bid after allowing for changes in certain points being \$89,977⁵⁰ - the President of the Board was authorized to sign a contract for the building, and the Treasurer was directed to pay out the funds in hand, or to come to him from the sale of the property at Dutchtown Monument Sts. on requisition by the architect, arrangements for providing the balance to be made early in the Fall.

It was decided that a bond for completion of the contract should be secured, the cost to be met by the Trustees under the terms of the contract.
