To the Monthly Meeting:

The Trustees have had suggested to them the possibility of a joint occupancy of the Light Street Meeting House by our members and by the Young Mens Christian Association as branch of their work for boys. We are of the opinion that a feasible plan can be arrived at which will not materially interfere with our work as at present carried on and will open the way for the Association to provide for a somewhat similar work for boys to that which was formerly carried on by our members and which we now seem unable to conduct upon a scale equal to the needs of the neighborhood.

In general terms we think that the Association might be allowed to have the use of the back part of the building, entrance to which is at the side, and we retain the front rooms, the use of the main audience room to be granted them if wanted when not in use by us, the Kindergarten to be continued as at present, certainly for this year.

To charge rental for the use of the building might subject us to taxation from which we are now exempt, so it is proposed that the Association shall pay all the expenses of running the building, our investment in it being our share, thus providing a co-operative use which would be within the letter and spirit of the law, the arrangement being made for two years to admit of thorough trial.

We submit this plan for the judgment of the Monthly Meeting, the full details of the plan to be agreed upon if it is approved in principle.
