On behalf of the Department of Education of Goucher College Miss McCarthy asked the Board if they would consider renting the rooms on the second floor of the Bible School building at Homewood for the establishment of a Kindergarten and Primary School - After full explanation of the plans and statement of requirements the Board was of the judgment that it would not be wise to make such an arrangement -

A request from the Second Presbyterian Church that we should arrange for them to meet in the Homewood Meeting House pending the completion of their new building having been referred to this Board by the Monthly Meeting with its approval was considered and referred to John B Thomas and John Albary in conjunction with the Chairman of the Monthly Meeting Committee on House and Grounds to complete arrangement of details.

The appropriation of sixty dollars for 1923 and the same amount for 1924 for the use of Light St Bible School from the income of the Francis White Fund having been referred to this Board with the approval of the Monthly Meeting was approved -
