KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

WHEREAS in the 11th and 12th paragraphs of the Last Will and Testament of the late Thomas Mackenzie, the following bequest was made to the Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends, Orthodox:

"XI - I give to the Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends, Orthodox, as an addition to its library, all of my books of a religious character, or at least such of them as my sisters may not desire to keep.

XII - I also give absolutely to the said Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends, Orthodox, the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars, to be known as "The Thomas Mackenzie Endowment Fund", and which I request shall be invested and the income therefrom annually reinvested for a period of (100) years, at which time the said legacy, with its accumulated interest will give the said Monthly Meeting a fund, with which or with the interest from which it will be enabled to carry on its religious and church work. I fully realize the doubtful legality of this request, but having seen the need of an endowment fund, for the uses of the Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends, of which I have been a member from birth, I hope that the meeting will endeavor to carry out my wishes in regard to this matter, by preserving the fund in the manner indicated." WHEREAS, Mrs. Katharine M. Brevitt, Surviving Executrix of his Estate has delivered to said legatee all of said books as aforesaid, and has also paid to said legatee the said legacy of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) as aforesaid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, therefore,

The said Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends, Homewood, does hereby release, acquit, exonerate and discharge the said Katharine M. Brevitt, Executrix, her heirs, successors, administrators and assigns, from all, and every action, suit, claim or demand which could or might possibly be brought, exhibited or prosecuted against the Estate of said Thomas Mackenzie, deceased, or the said Executrix, her heirs, successors, administrators and assigns, or any of them, for or on account of the said legacies as aforesaid, or the payment or delivery thereof to it, hereby declaring itself fully satisfied, contented and paid as above specified.
