

At a called meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting held on April 17, 1930, there were present Miles White, Jr., John C. Thomas, James Carey, Jr., and Richard L. Cary. The following resolution was adopted:—Resolved that the Treasurer, Miles White, Jr., be authorized to retain Anwalt & Rodgers, duly licensed real estate brokers, as our exclusive agents to sell Friends' Gospel Mission, located at No. 1010 Light Street, consisting of a lot with approximately fifty-six feet frontage on Light Street and a depth of approximately two hundred and sixty-three feet, improved by a brick church building and a gymnasium building and a two-story brick dwelling on the rear, but excluding the dwelling properties fronting on Patapsco Street, including the buildings and improvements thereon and including the fixtures and equipment, at a price of \$35,000.00.

The meeting then adjourned.

At a called meeting of the Trustees of Baltimore Monthly Meeting, held on April 30, 1930, there were present John C. Thomas, Miles White, Jr., James Carey, Jr., John W. Parker and Richard L. Cary. — Miles White, Jr., had been told that members of Light Street Meeting dislike a sign which Anwalt and Rodgers have erected on the property to advertise its sale; but adds that the objectors, at last report, seem less opposed to it. No action was taken.

Morris Rodgers, of the above firm, having been asked to attend, discussed possible purchasers of the property. Nearness of a motion-picture house would seem to preclude its use as a garage; it is narrower than motion-picture operators now desire; it might be used for light manufacturing; no church is known to be interested

in purchasing it; apartment houses are not thought profitable in that neighborhood. Its sale will presumably be slow. No action was taken.

The Treasurer reported the receipt of \$3000.00 as the bequest of Richard G. White, deceased. He was authorized to invest it in 4 percent preferred stock of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company at the market.

The Secretary was instructed to place the seal of the Monthly Meeting in the vault at the Meeting House.
