She is a poor ignorant creature - to whom the kindness and counsel of Christian friends may prove beneficial - for she is surrounded by influences very adverse to her advancement in a knowledge of the truth - in addition to this our care may add to her physical comforts - as we have permission from the Warden and the Physician to take to her any delicacy she may desire.

At a meeting of Friends Association for visiting the Prison held 10th Mo. 1853.

The meeting was informed that for several weeks previous the prison had been regularly visited - and that once or twice a week throughout the summer attention was given to Anne Davis - the sick woman of whom mention was made in our last recorded minutes. She has been summoned, we trust, to a better home - for altho from extreme debility and oppression about the lungs, unable to give expression to much beyond monosyllables - yet the irritability and evil

temper manifested during the early part of her illness - had become entirely subdued - she was patient and uncomplaining - expressed herself willing to rely upon her Savior and not afraid to die - and showed great comfort in the visits that were made her. She was very ignorant and unenlightened and had to be dealt with as a little child - but we felt she was in the hands of One - who requires but little of those to whom little has been given - and we could not but hope that in mercy - her sins forgiven - she had been called to rest.

It gives us pleasure to notice the great kindness and care not only of the warden - but of her fellow prisoners also. She was made as comfortable as the circumstances of the case would possibly admit - and one of the women read to her the whole of the New Testament during her illness.

No notice has yet been taken of the application on behalf of Mary Coleman.

Sarah Janney and Margaret White are appointed to visit next month.
