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We have felt so much encouraged in this field of labor - and we believe our school has never been more prosperous. All the committee have been in attendance except our friend H. A. Tyson who has been prevented by indisposition, and we have had the aid of several other friends in addition, and the exercises have been conducted with spirit and energy, both by teachers and scholars.

We have been much gratified by the promptness with which some of the women have acted upon a mere suggestion of ours, and established a school amongst themselves on First day Morning - the more advanced taking under their charge those who are beginners - Margaret Knox, one of the most promising scholars informed us, that she had a class of eight, whose names we registered, and, upon asking for more teachers - four other women offered to take classes, and twenty three women agreed to place themselves

under their instruction. We felt that the only hope of success, was in making it entirely voluntary with them, and we informed them that we wished this organization to continue during the summer recess.

Within the last mo, two women have entered the prison, Sarah Collins, and Mary Harper

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The latter sentenced for five years for stealing an umbrella Anne Powell and Matilda Wilmer have been discharged. The latter is the hard Matilda Wilmer is the last of those who were in the Prison when we first visited it.

A discharged convict, Sarah Wilson who has conducted herself well and lived with the same person for two years, called on one of our friends recently with the request that she would take a little bundle of tracts which she had read, and distribute amongst some of the women with her love to them - this, amidst the many discouraging things with which we have to contend was a very gratifying and cheering incident.

We have had an opportunity for inspecting the library and have had some conversation with the Librarian an intelligent young man who has excited our warmest sympathy. The Warden reports him as a remarkable instance of elevation from extreme degradation - and as a proof of his confidence has entrusted him with the care of the books - He would have preferred placing them under the care of one of the officers but found it impracticable. Upwards of 150 men have been thrown
