apparent fruits of individual moral improvement, yet
they have cause to believe some general good has resulted
to the prisoners from their care and oversight.

taken into the family of one of the friends who visit
the Penitentiary, and is doing well. Louisa Watkins
was also provided with a home, where she staid about
two days, and left without giving any notice to the
family - she has since been taken up for stealing
a dress. Anne Myers was said to have conducted
herself very well during her term of confinement,
and some fruitless efforts were made to find her
parents who are reported to be clever colored people.
