Why did my darling tell a lie did she forget that God was by that God who saw the thing she did from whom no action can be hid did she forget that God could see and here wherever she might be he made our eyes and can discern which ever way we think to turn he made our ears and he can hear where we may think nobody near in every place by night and day he watches all we do and say there always be afraid my dear to tell a lie for God does hear now I think no more at present but I remain your unworthy scholar
