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Riley has been taken to the Alms House,
where she seems more comfortable & cheerful
than she has done for a long time: her little
boy has found a happy home in the Orphan Asylum.
Maria Peck returned to her husband,
but her home is so peculiarly uncomfortable
that we must recommend her to the care
of the association.

Ellen Thompson is with her mother who
is sick, aged, and in extreme poverty, she
also will require care.

The parents of Arianna Brown who are
worthy respectable colored persons, have her
with them & promise to keep her at home.

Margaret Small has found a good service
place in a respectable family, and
Susan Green we have heard, is married to
one, who was at the time of her imprisonment
also in the Penitentiary, and gone to reside
in the country. We would urge upon the
association to bear those in mind who
have gone from under our care, not to
feel that our labors are at an end when
they leave the walls of the prison, but
occasionally call & encourage them in well doing.

We feel more than ever the need of bearing
in mind the Apostolic injunction, Be not weary
in well doing: the field is increasingly large,

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& the fruits are but few, still there is enough
to encourage us to persevere, for we know that
under the Divine blessing, good is sometimes
brought by the weakest instruments.

It was the judgment of the meeting that
head bands or aprons be given as a reward
to such of the convicts as are willing to
abstain from the use of snuff, to be handed
them by the visiting committee for next month
also that calico for patch work, or
something equivalent which will furnish
them a agreeable occupation during their leisure
hours, be distributed monthly, to those of whose
conduct the Matrons may make a favorable
report.

Catharine Smith, Julia Wilson & Hannah Tall
were named to take Maria Peck's case under care.

Catharine Smith's name was added to the
committee appointed to have a charge over
released prisoners.

H. A. Tyson, Julia Wilson, Phoebe Thomas
& Sarah Savage were named to visit for
the ensuing month.
