comfort and improvement of the prisoners,

health which rendered her duties too laborious
and exposing

report for the past month. The Prison has
been visited three times & the deportment of the convicts
correct, three of the women were confined to their
cells on the first visit, for disorderly behavior
before the arrival of the committee, which caused
the Warden to prohibit their being assembled
until the committee came, The regulations we do
not think will answer, as we were there, more
than half an hour waiting for the women to
assemble, & it was some time before perfect
quiet could be observed.

A report of the small pox having again
appeared on the men's side of the Prison
prevented our attendance once, & rain
