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saw her on board the Phila boat. He
was urged against this course as much
as was thought proper. Wd that the
Penitentiary was the best place for her,
and that her return there might
perhaps be the means of her salvation.
but he said he had thought much
about it - and could not bring his mind
to feel willing to be the instrument of
placing her there again. We much
regret this decision for she is a per-
sonal creature, easily led into
temptation, and influenced to any thing
by the associates with whom she is thrown
and is entirely destitute of any moral
restraints as to be an unsafe member
of society.

The Friends appointed last month
were continued to visit the ensuing month.
The meeting adjourned

The committee have regularly visited the
Penitentiary with one or two exceptions occasioned
by inclement weather. The conduct of the
prisoners in school, has generally been satisfactory
and we have had but few complaints from
the Matron. We have been pleased to see in
some of the most degraded, evident
improvement in their manners; and an
increased interest in their lessons. How far
the moral and religious instruction imparted
may influence their future character, time only
can determine. We may hope it will be as the
heaven bid in the meal, and that we shall
not be weary of well doing. The past experience
may lead to discouraging conclusions. Rachel
Ramsey has been pardoned by the Governor & has got
