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who have left the Prison must be so
unfavorable and discouraging. Sarah
Janney procured good places in the
country, for several women dismissed
this summer all of whom in a little
while were discharged for intemperance
or theft - and Harriet Gasway - the
woman who was imprisoned for
assisting her husband to escape from
slavery - was arrested for theft a few
weeks ago, and sold out of the state
for several years - Rachel Ramsey
for whom a very good home was
provided - became so intemperate, that
the family had to part with her in a
few months, and nothing has since been
heard of her. By accounts received from
Phil^a we learn that Agnes Boyle, after
her many escapes from justice, has at
length been sentenced to the Penitentiary
of which she is now an inmate. A
friend who saw her there, said she
attempted no extenuation of her faults,
made enquiries concerning her Baltimore
friends and expressed a hope that
Julia Wilson would come and see
her when next in Phil^a. We have heard
no particulars with regard to her

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term of imprisonment, but hope to be
able to report next month.
