Girls Sewing School. The attendance has been regular, and the children show improvement. At Christmas the usual annual entertainment was held, and the distributions of presents made; twelve classes were in the main room.

Young Womens Christian Fellowship Union has regularly held its meetings from eleventh month, 1903, to fifth month, 1904, with large attendance; the Bible Class has been very helpful.

The Boys Meeting on Federal Hill has been carried on, as usual, during the past year, and much good work has been accomplished, although somewhat hampered by the lack of teachers.

The Eutaw and Monument Street Bible School opened in the Autumn, with more than ordinary interest manifested, and with every hope of a most successful year; subsequent discouragements were, however, overcome, and a generally good attendance and continued interest were reported.
