Report of the Mothers Meeting, 1868 to 1904.

In eleventh month, 1868, a committee consisting of Julia Valentine, Ann T. Matthews, Mary W. Thomas, Elizabeth Hopkins, Mary Dawson, and others, was appointed to open a Mothers Meeting on Federal Hill, in a room situated on the corner of Light and Montgomery Streets.

Commencing with five names, the attendance increased week by week, until, before the close of the winter, they had entered ninety-five names upon their book.

I will insert an extract from one of the early Reports, explaining the methods adopted:

"The Meeting opens on Third Day, afternoon, at three o'clock.
