

A regular meeting of the Association for Christian Work was held in the basement of the Meeting House October 11th, 1905. In the absence of the President, the Vice President, Caswell Graves, occupied the Chair. The Secretary, Cassandra C. Platto, having removed to Philadelphia, sent in her resignation, which was accepted, and Emily B. Barnard was elected Secretary in her place.

The committee appointed at the last meeting to audit the Treasurer's account, reported that they had done so, and found it correct, with the necessary vouchers.

The Executive Committee reported the following Constitution for the Association, which was adopted as reported, and as it appears below:

Constitution.

This Association shall be known as The Association for Christian Work of The Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Orthodox).

Object.

The object of this Association shall be the co-ordination of the religious and philanthropic work of Eutaw Street congregation, not directly under the care of the Monthly Meeting, and to promote a spirit of social and religious fellowship among her members and attenders.

Membership.

All members and regular attenders of Eutaw Street Meeting shall be considered as entitled to membership in the Association, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the business meetings.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall perform the duties usually allotted to such officers.

Executive Committee.

This committee shall consist of the regular officers of the Association and a representative from each of the committees representing the different branches of work reporting to the Association. It shall see that the different departments of work are adequately supported, and shall discharge such other duties as may be assigned to it by this Constitution. Special matters of business may also be referred to this Committee for attention.

Literary Committee.

This Committee shall consist of at least (6) six members. It shall be charged with preparing a programme for the meetings of the Association, and have the oversight of such literary exercises and lectures as may be given during the year.
