

the Baltimore Meeting at Eutaw and Monument Streets and that at 7010 Light Street as required by the New Discipline Part II Chap XII Sect 1, which were considered and the following summary of the information received as to the Spiritual Condition and Life of these congregations was directed to be forwarded to our Quarterly Meeting on Ministry and Oversight:

Summary.

Verbal reports have been made at this time relative to our two Congregations in Baltimore, but none relating to the Bouldersville Meeting as no member of that Meeting was present.

These reports agree in regarding the spiritual life and condition of the meetings as distinctly encouraging, and that an increasing interest was being manifested by some meetings, and in the membership generally.

The attendance of Light Street Meeting was reported to be about the same as heretofore; of Eutaw St Meeting it was thought there had been an increased attendance on First day Mornings and on Fifth days.

A few of the members of Light Street Congregation have given evidence of the reception of Spiritual Gifts for the help and encouragement of others manifested by occasional short testimonies and

exhortations. A concern and desire was expressed for both Meetings, that there may be a more general taking part by those in the body of the Meeting, in prayer and exhortation, and a stronger disposition to come forward in the work of the Church.

Reports on the Ministry indicated that it had been generally helpful and instructive, and was regarded as having been quite satisfactory. Some thought it had broadened and deepened.

Reporting as to new work, mention was made of the active part taken by members of Light Street Congregation, in originating and aiding a recent ~~work~~ union work of the neighboring Churches, which was believed to have been helpful to those who have attended, and to have been stimulating to the Churches which have united in the Movement.

In Eutaw Street Meeting plans had been formed for new work in certain directions, which have however been interfered with by serious illness in the families of several of our members.
