Report.

At the two meetings which have occurred since our last report, we have considered with a good degree of care, the membership at Entaw St. & Light St. Mtgs. comprising Balto. Mtg. and to aid us in this, have had a carefully prepared list of our members, made, separating the members of the two meetings, and the resident from the non-resident members. At Baltimore Local Meeting on Ministry & Oversight held Ninth mo. 16, 1914. Fourteen members were present.

After a season of prayer the minutes were read.

Proclamation

The clerk called the attention of this meeting to the proclamation issued by President Woodrow Wilson - that on October 4th all God-fearing persons should assemble in their places of worship, to unite in prayer for the restoration of peace among the warring nations.

The meeting assented to a suggestion by the clerk that special notices be sent to our members and attenders, informing them of the action of this meeting and inviting them to attend the meeting for worship Oct. 4th, also that the Proclamation be read at that time. Arrangements for same to be left to the Efficiency Com.

The meeting then passed to the consideration of the report to the Quarterly Meeting. Considerable time was given to discussion bearing upon the spiritual condition and life of the congregation, the religious work engaged in, outside our meeting, by our members and the development of gifts.

Reference was made to the fact, that there is little evidence of the development of spiritual gifts among our young people. They are nevertheless trying to serve Jesus Christ.
