the Mothers Meetings are growing in numbers and interest.

The attendance at Eutaw Street First-day morning meetings have been somewhat affected by the services held at Tabernacle.

The Bible School is small but the interest is maintained by those who do attend. The decrease in attendance this year is in a measure due to a number of the children attending schools out of town. The Ministry is excellent and while the attendance at the Fifth-day meetings is small the spirit of the meetings has been unusually good.
