For some reason the interest in the Fifth-day meeting has been difficult to maintain.

First day evening meetings were held during first and second months.

On first month, second, J. Douglas Adams addressed the meeting and second month, fifth, Malcolm W. Davis spoke at the meeting and the remaining meetings were addressed by Elbert Russell.

As the Neighborhood Meetings were such a factor in the preparation for the work in the "Sunday Campaign", this Committee thought such meetings might be helpful to our meetings: accordingly a Committee was appointed to arrange for holding them when they should open. Several were held with profit.

Through the concern of one of our members

a special prayer meeting for the work of the meeting and the quickening of the life of our membership, was appointed to be held at the close of first day morning meeting on fourth month sixteenth. With very few exceptions the entire congregation attended and the meeting was inspiring and helpful.

The Bible School has been small in numbers during the year but the interest has been kept up. The School is under the direction of a new Superintendent but as yet has not been able to meet as a whole owing to the age restrictions by the Health Board.

The Bible Class for men under Elbert Russell's leadership has had a successful year but not as large a membership as was desired. The Class has resumed its work for the year. Elbert Russell's Class for the young people from Eutaw Street and Park Avenue Friends held during the winter, studied the "Life of Christ". The class will be continued this winter.

At Eight Street the first day morning meetings are always small but the attendance at the evening meetings is good. The "Round Table" programs have added much to the interest of these meetings.

The Bible School continues small; there is a large class of children which might be divided were teachers available.
