The attendance at the First-day Meetings at Entaw Street is about the same as last year and the Bible School is in good condition. Luella Russell, the new Superintendent, is endeavoring to enlist the interest of the adult members of the meeting who are not enrolled.

The Men's and Women's Bible Classes have about the same number in attendance as last year and the interest is well maintained.

The Young Friends have organized and meet First-day evening to study the parables of the Master by Foxgill.

The meetings at Light Street have their usual attendance.

The evening meetings occasionally have an illustrated lecture. The Men's Bible Class, from which four new classes were formed last year - has nearly regained its former membership.

The Women's Bible Class led by Margaret J. Carey has a large attendance and much interest is shown. A mothers Club, in connection with the Summer play ground meets once a week and has an excellent influence on the women of the neighborhood. There is a "Young Men's Christian League" which meets at Light Street under the care of one of the young men from Entaw Street meeting. While this organization

does not belong to the Meeting in any sense - it is one of the activities in the Light Street Building which tends towards Character Building. The Bible School still has its needs of teachers. A plan is about to be started which is hoped may help in its development.
