In presenting a report concerning the work at Light St., I would first express my sincere appreciation of the faithful and self-sacrificing labors of all those who have aided in the work hitherto. From what I have been able to observe and to hear I am sure much good seed has been sown in good ground, and good fruit has resulted. It has been a pleasure and a privilege for me to enter into their labors.

The work is as you all know, of a peculiar character. It has been carried on for years as a Mission. The work is certainly needed in the district and has had a great influence upon the character of the neighborhood.

SUNDAY SCHOOL. From the beginning of my work I have assisted in the work of the Sunday School, at first teaching a boys' class and since the beginning of this year as Superintendent. I believe good work has been done. The average attendance is about 35 in the Primary Department and about the same number in the main school. During the year about nine children have been promoted from the primary to the main school. We now urgently need a young woman to teach a girls' class. The recent Ada Schaeffer, has had to resign owing to the death of her foster mother.

GOSPEL SERVICE. It has been a great privilege to have given the Gospel message on Sunday evening. The attendance has, I believe somewhat grown, and is well maintained in regularity. At my recommendation the meeting has been held for several weeks upstairs. I consider the room more homey, comfortable and suitable than the very large room down stairs. For several weeks, by request, I gave a series of addresses on the great experiences in the life of Jesus Christ, and I am about to begin a similar series on the life of the Apostle Paul.

GYMNASIUM. Very successful gymnasium classes have been held this winter, especially successful with the girls, the average attendance being between thirty and forty. Miss Weber proved a very capable teacher. She had junior and senior divisions. The boys' classes were not so large but good was done.

VISITING. My wife and I have visited the homes of the members and attenders as way opened.

ACTIVITIES. The building is a perfect hive of activities and it has taken me many months to get in touch with all departments of the work. The first year has been largely a year of learning. I hope next year to work more intelligently and efficiently.
