TO MEMBERS OF BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING:

The Pastoral Committee of the Monthly Meeting, in its consideration of the interests of the Church, have been impressed with the importance of the Bible School. A large proportion of our active workers received training there and most of those who have applied for membership with us in recent years were first interested in the school.

These facts indicate clearly the useful position the school holds, and they justify our appeal to you to use your influence in its behalf. Possibly there are children within your circle who could be brought to the school by the exercise of a little effort. Possibly some older person would join one of the Bible Classes if asked in a sufficiently earnest manner.
