

and church responsibility and those who find congenial fellowship in another church share in its activities and support, but desire to retain their membership with us. Both of these types would be helped by keeping them informed of the work and interests of the meeting. As this would require much correspondence John R. Carey and Margaret J. Carey were appointed to devise some plan by which this aim may be accomplished and report to our next meeting.

James Carey Jr. felt a concern that the Pastoral Committee consider seriously its duty toward two definite things - its Non-Resident and its responsibility for an efficient spiritual element in our Bible Schools. Stating the latter is as much our responsibility as are the meetings for worship. He called attention to the young people members with us who are not in the Bible School and that the young people on this Committee might be able to get these into the school. No action was taken.

*Application* An application for membership was received from Lucy A. Winston. The request was considered and on favorable report from Anna B. Thomas of an interview with Miss Winston - the meeting approved and directed Clerk to forward application to the monthly meeting. After a devotional time the meeting adjourned.

The Pastoral Committee and meeting on Ministry and Oversight met May 19, 1920. 110 members were present. After a time of prayer Margaret J. Carey was appointed secretary pro tem. as A. Viola Horstberg was absent.

The minutes were read and with changes adopted.

The report of the Committee on Non-Resident members was read and is as follows.

The Committee to consider what could be done for the Non-Resident members suggest that -  
A Committee of three be appointed by the Pastoral Com. whose duty it shall be to foster and develop the spiritual life and service in the Kingdom of Non-Resident members of Ballymore Monthly Meeting.

That as methods of working the following be suggested.

They shall regularly and frequently consult the list of members and endeavor to promptly establish such relations with any moving away - that they shall be encouraged to form a church connection immediately on their arrival at a new residence.

When they are to be near a Friends Mtg. the importance of connection with it should be suggested, and a letter be written to the officers of the meeting, giving name and address of our member, asking that attention be shown them.

If the member removing is not near a Friends meeting he should be encouraged to regularly attend and to unite in the work of a Christian church which most nearly meets his preferences with the suggestion that our Monthly Meeting will send a letter to that church, through him
