While at college there was pastor in a meeting & also served a congregational church while at Hartford. For a summer he was in a little meeting called Allens Neck in New England. Lewis Moon then left the room & friends expressed their views. The decision was they liked him and it was left to the Eyes Com. of the Every. Com. to make arrangements with him.

10/12/1921 The Pastoral Com. met at Light St. Meeting 10/12/1921 in a special meeting asking a number of interested members of the Light St. Congregation to be present to talk over the possibilities for the two congregations to work to gether this fall.

The Bible School was discussed and the desire expressed that when the move was made to the Homewood Meeting House the Light St. Bible School should be

left stronger & not weaker.

After discussing methods of getting the attendance & interest of the Light St. Congregation it was decided to form teams of one Light St. friend & one Easton St. friend to visit every member on one first day.

James Hunter, John C. Thomas and L. M. Lachem, Thurston & Margaret T. Carey were appointed to apportion the members to the various teams.

When the visit was prayed an invitation was then given to the morning & evening meetings on first day and to the monthly meetings and approaching yearly meetings.

After a time of prayer the meeting adjourned.
