

February 16th 1923 -

A meeting of the Pastoral Committee was held February 15th 1923.

Sixteen members were present.

The Clerk spoke of the better results accomplished by working in a definite scientific way in association with the Church leaders.

Reported that the matter of reciprocal visiting was brought to the attention of the membership at meeting for worship.

Progress in plans for the series of meetings was reported and it was decided that as far as practicable, the membership should be visited according to lists or by exchange to encourage attendance at these meetings and programs for same should be freely distributed.

Decided to serve a supper on Saturday 18th arrangement of same to left to Elizabeth McCully. Price of supper to be put on program.

The Committee on Nominations for Clerk and Recording Clerk named James Carey Jr for Clerk. Mary E. Carey for Recording Clerk and A. Viola Horisberg for Secretary of Visiting which was approved.

The Committee on joint Carriage of the Community reported that a half day was given to it, but on account of bad weather the completion of Carriage was postponed indefinitely. But the Carriage for the Story House

would be continued.

The Young People's Committee told of plans jointly with Park Ave. Friends (Young People) for a social for the use of town students ofoucher College and Johns Hopkins University.

Announcement was made of an Interracial Conference to be held at Park Avenue Meeting House Feb. 16th & 17th.

Lewis C. Moon expressed a concern that the capable young people of our meeting should receive more encouragement to vocal service in the meetings for worship.

The Committee on Non-resident members reported that most of them as far as addressed could be found had been written to.
