

June 14th 1923
The Pastoral Committee was held June fourteenth. Thirteen members were present.

Meeting was opened by time of prayer. The Secretary not being present Lewis C. Moore was asked to act for the time. Minutes were omitted because they were not in hand.

The matter of bringing some outside minister to the Meeting for one Sunday each month was discussed.

Suggestion was made that such person could possibly be used in the Men's Bible Class. Since the Committee was not clear as to making definite dates each month and asking some minister to come and fill them, it was decided to appoint a small Committee to take the matter under advisement, and to encourage visiting ministers to be present in our meetings and bring whatever messages they may be glad to bring. The matter of closer cooperation between the Pastoral Committee and the Executive Committee of the Monthly Meeting was discussed at this time, with special reference to the work of the Secretary. The sense of this Committee is that the Pastoral Committee should be definitely represented on the Executive Committee and this Committee asked the Nominating

Committee to leave this in mind when appointing the new Committee and to make suggestion to the Monthly Meeting.

An application for membership was received from Ivan M. Price. The application was accepted and ordered forwarded to the Monthly Meeting with the approval of this Committee.
