Report of Baltimore Local Meeting on Ministry and Oversight.

At Baltimore Local Meeting on Ministry and Oversight held Tenth month 7,
 1923, the following report was adopted and directed to be forwarded to the Quarterly
 Meeting on Ministry and Oversight to be held at Darlington, Maryland, Tenth month
 13, 1923.

Outward signs seem to indicate a fairly satisfactory condition of spiritual
 life among the members of Baltimore Monthly Meeting. The attendance at meetings
 for worship on First day mornings has been well sustained, and the ministry live and
 helpful. The removal from Baltimore of William H. Morris has been a distinct
 loss to the meeting, for his ministry has been very acceptable.

Under the direction of a special committee efforts were made to develop the
 life and interest of the mid-week meeting at Homewood by the adoption of a varied
 program to occupy part of each meeting, the Mission study lessons being used and brief
 accounts of the lives of some of the earlier Friends were given.

The First day evening meeting at Light Street was held during the usual
 season with about the same attendance as in recent years, and there is a group of
 well concerned Friends interested in the work at that place at the present time.

A much appreciated and helpful incident of the year was a visit from two
 English Friends, A. Neave Braysnew and J. Rowntree Gillett. Special meetings were
 held and opportunity was given to our Friends to meet them informally.

We have endeavored to provide pastoral care for the members of the meeting
 and have corresponded with those non-resident.

The Homewood Meeting house has been used in the effort to show a Christian
 interest in the students of the colleges near by.
